
Safety and Hygiene Station is designed to work in conjunction with our patented Comfort Station (#6721967). This system is designed to meet or exceed health and safety job site regulations.



Type Three: Used in conjunction with our patented Comfort Station #6721967. Decontamination Shelter can be used in any application either behind – incorporated inside – or on either the left or right side of the Comfort Station.



The Eyewash and Shower Units can either be stand-alone units or combined in a stall to be used simultaneously. The unit floor can be set on an internal tank or plumbed to an external tank



The Water Source provides water that meets the EPA's national primary drinking water regulations. It supplies both hot and cold water that addresses rehydration requirements and is safe to rinse wounds. Every time the sink or toilet is used in the Comfort Station, the entire decontamination water supply system is being tested.



The Decontamination Shelter comes with a 5 gallon water heater that runs on 110v.



The Folding Stretcher is equipped with two blankets and restraining straps. Stretcher folds up and stores in a corner with blankets and a first aid kit with easy access.



A Basket Stretcher is available when local or Federal health and safety laws require.






Emergency Folding Beds are available if required. Beds are made with steel tubing and can be deployed in minutes.

Decontamination Consumables: include items such as safety storage bags for discarded decontamination clothing, plastic and/or paper change of clothes. An ample supply of paper towels, disinfecting soaps, eye wash solutions, and mouth wash will be available for immediate use. The stretcher storage area will have an approved first aid kit suitable for the type of work being performed. Customers may request that an automated external defibrillator be supplied if required. The Decontamination Shelter will have a fire extinguisher and a smoke detector.


Lavatory/Health & Safety Building








Wall Mounted Eyewash Unit. This unit is plumbed to the water system and water pressure is supplied by a municipal water system or by our installed water pressure pumping system. Four ways in which eyewash and safety showers are used are shown below.





The decontamination shower has a pull handle for instant premixed hot and cold water. The water system can be metered and contained where hazardous material needs to be contained. The Shower and Water Supply Health and Safety System will promote proper – Dilution – Warming & Cooling –Irrigation – Extinguishment. This unit provides constant testing and obstruction free access for use.



Plumbing Information:

<u>Decontamination Shower</u> utilizes a metered water source and a free-standing waste water holding tank for the water runoff. The waste water holding tank is plumbed to the shower separately and is sealable and exchangeable.

<u>Water Pressure Pump</u> allows for directional control of the water flow. This will allow for additional water to be directed to the Decontamination Shower.

<u>Constant System Testing</u> by the use of the fresh water hand wash and fresh water flush toilet in the Lavatory/Health & Safety Building, the operational integrity is being tested on a continuous basis.

Lavatory/Health & Safety Building - Mobility





Building has up to 4 tine ports for maximum mobility.

Obstruction Free Access



During hours of operation the doorways will be unobstructed and will be outfitted with plastic transparent strips to allow maximum ease of access. The main entrance can be secured with an externally lockable door.

The Decontamination Shelter will be large enough for use by the injured party and an assisting person.
